HCCSAAA Membership is available to those who have graduated from the Hays County Citizens Sheriff's Academy and whose dues are paid in full. Dues are collected annually in January and are currently \$12 per year.

Honorary membership is open to persons nominated by the Executive Board or the regular membership and approved by majority vote of the attending members. Honorary members do not pay dues, nor do they have voting rights.
